### What is Digital Body Language?

#### The Body Language Myth

You've probably heard that when we communicate:

- Our body language conveys 55% of the message
- The tone of our voice represents 38%
- Our actual words convey only 7%



Well, it's NOT true. It is a misinterpretation of some research conducted by Albert Mehrabian in 1967. However, when words and non-verbal messages conflict, people always believe the non-verbal! – Credit: Erica Dhawan

#### Digital Body Language Truth

It's about leading and teaming in a digital world. So much depends on body language

- Connection and trust
- Communication completeness
- Collaboration success

However, even for in-person teams, so much now happens digitally!

- It gives us global access to resources
- It saves on travel time and unnecessary meetings
- Remote and mobile work
- Personal work preferences



### Why does it matter?

- Collaboration Platforms (Teams, Monday, Slack, Trello, etc.)

### When do we need to be more skilled in it?

The answer is a simple question: ***When did your teams start connecting, communicating, and collaborating digitally?***



### How do we improve our digital body language?

Always use the most effective platform for each type of communication and collaboration

#### Text such as email and WhatsApp.

Problem - the tone of 50% of text messages is misinterpreted!

- State question / topic / request / action up front
- Traffic light at the beginning of a message
  - Red - stop! I need help right now
  - Amber - take note! This may be important in future
  - Green - go team! Good news and connection
- Using a safe word
- Accept and agree that text platforms are not great collaboration

#### Voice and Video such as voice notes, calls, and meetings

Problem - searching voice notes and multitasking / not being present

- Make voice notes searchable by adding text subject lines
- Make sure voice calls and meetings have documented summaries
- Combat multitasking and use camera as much as possible
- Eliminate pointless meetings
  - Meet only for things that really need a meeting
  - Voice / video notes and screencasts for information and clarification

#### NB - The importance of Video and cameras

- Connection
- Trust
- Engagement
- Therefore, efficiency and effectiveness - speed!

#### Asynchronous collaboration such as using teaming platforms

Problem - overwhelm, black holes and incompetence with the tools

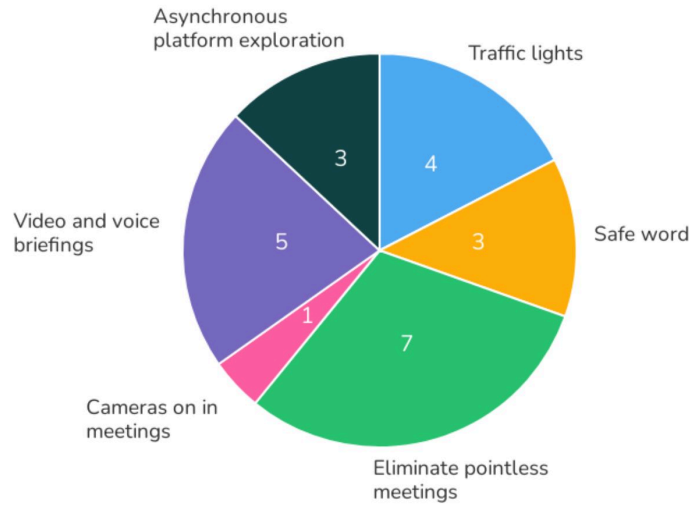
- The power of asynchronous collaboration
- Clear agreements about standards and usage norms
- Visibility protocols and accountability!
- Upskilling for everyone
